Parish Work

West Wycombe Parish Council was formed in 1987 which means we are now in our twenty-ninth year.

I have been a member of the Parish Council since the beginning and would like to say how grateful I am that over these years we have had councillors who have been committed to making the whole of West Wycombe Parish a good place to live and work.

Over the years we have achieved a huge amount of things that have contributed to the safety, wellbeing and leisure of the residents of West Wycombe.

The Burial Ground



It took well over ten years of constant nagging of every department you can think of, much form filling, reporting and submissions of applications, together with many hours of deliberation and planning to complete the burial ground behind St Paul's Church which we opened for residents in 2000.

When we asked our residents, in a survey, what would be high on their wish list for the Parish, a children's playground and allotments came top. We have managed to provide both! These, together with the Burial Ground, are on land leased from West Wycombe Estate because the Parish Council does not own any land or property.

Parish Work

Defibrillators

Recently we purchased two defibrillators that are linked directly to the NHS Ambulance Service.

One is installed on West Wycombe Village Hall and hopefully, soon, the other will be installed on the top of West Wycombe Hill, by the gate leading to St Lawrence Church.

If needed these will help not only local people but visitors to the parish too.



Grit, Poo and HS2

We have now placed and filled grit bins on most of our roads to help in bad weather conditions but please remember that the grit is for you to use on the public road and pavements.

Recently we have installed dog poo bins and we pay for these to be emptied as often as required. But we are still having problems with dog walkers on the Pedestal Playing Field who let their dogs run free and then don't clear up after them. We will ban dogs completely if people don't respect the rules.

We are actively still trying to get the route for HS2 construction traffic removed from coming through our Parish. This is an on going consultation. Sharon has worked hard on this for many months taking our petition up to London and delivering it to Parliament by hand.

Quality or Award Scheme Council

The keen eyed amongst you will have noticed that the Quality Council Logo has been removed from the website and this publication; that is because the scheme no longer exists. It has been replaced by the Local Council Award Scheme. Councils who qualified for the Quality Council status have been given, on application, Foundation status in the new scheme.

There were many rumours and suggestions that becoming a Quality Council would make various benefits and enhancements available, but these never materialised.

It cost the Council £150.00 to achieve Quality status and a considerable amount of work for Sharon, our Clerk, upon whose knowledge and ability the Quality status is based so, we are keeping an open mind about the new scheme before venturing down another yellow brick road that has no pot of gold at the end.

Planning

We are noticing a small increase in the number of planning applications which we are being asked to comment upon by Wycombe District Council.

One area that we are not involved in is Neighbourhood Planning. If you visit other parish council websites, Longwick cum Ilmer being the latest, you'll see that they have spent considerable time and money in constructing their plan which will hopefully enable them to control the building in the parish through to 2030.

Parish Council's are funded from what's called the Precept. This is a sum of money that is taken out of the Council Tax. Parish Councillors receive no income - all their time and efforts are given volutarily.

Visitors and Usage

Information

Our website still attracts many visitors, far in excess of what would normally be expected from a parish with only 1000 people. During the period May 2014 to 2015 the site received 953 visitors who generated 3,569 page impressions.

In addition to the UK we had visitors from the USA, Australia, Canada, Denmark, Germany, India, Isle of Man, Japan, Netherlands, South Africa, Cayman Islands, Cote D'Ivoire, Croatia and many more.

Three quarters of all search results came from Google with Chrome and Safari sharing top spot for most popular browser, followed by Firefox and Internet Explorer last.

When it came to search terms, the most popular was, obviously, "west wycombe parish council" followed by "west wycombe" but some of the more unexpected were "lesslie watson", "abandoned village west wycombe", "dr faith spicer cave cottage west wycombe" and "r s troutt accounts"

Having undergone a major facelift last year development hasn't stopped. We continue to provide news and details of forthcoming events and we recently added a new page with details of the grass cutting that we have taken over from Buckinghamshire County Council.



Devolved Powers



Urban Grass Cutting

Bucks CC have to spend 60-70% of their budget on Adult Social Care and Child Protection; these are statutory requirements. As a result of this some services are being devolved to Parish Councils.

As your elected Parish Council we are keen to control our own environment by carrying out work at the right time and to a good standard. However, this all comes at a cost.

We have appointed our own grass cutting contractor, ensured that adequate insurances are in place and risk assessments established; all of this has been paid for by Bucks CC. for this year and the next, however, we will have to find those funds, from our Precept, in the future.

The map above shows the areas in dark green for which we are now responsible. All other areas remain the responsibility of Bucks CC because they are located outside the 30mph speed restriction.

Urban Hedge & Tree Management

Whilst we are not directly responsible for the cutting of hedges and trees which impede the footpath and roadway, we are now responsible for policing.

It is the responsibility of home and business owners to cut back trees and hedges. If the Parish Council needs to contact an owner to instigate the work a deadline will be provided after which, the Parish Council will carry out the work and invoice the landowner.
