



Risk Assessment – 2014/2015

School crossing patrol - BCC responsibility

Salt bin by Garden Centre – WWPC to fill – insured

Salt bin by Beechwood Road BCC fill – insured

Salt bin by school – BCC fill and responsibility

Lights: Chorley Road, Bradenham Road, Church Lane, opposite the Caves, outside the school – all insured.

Bus shelters – 2 - insured (Bradenham Road and at the Pedestal). Regular maintenance.

Bench in burial ground -insured

Benches in front of Church Room - insured

Trees in burial ground regularly maintained by Lawrence Landscapes

5 Noticeboards – insured and maintained

Noticeboard in burial ground – insured and maintained

Gates in burial ground – inspected and maintained –stock fencing checked by Parish Council and shepherd. Parish Council organises repair.

Headstones and memorials – responsibility of the families and the memorial masons.

Stand pipe in burial ground – checked each winter

Handrails by Farthing Cottage and WW Estate car park – checked for stability/maintained

Steps up from car park to school house - maintained

Setts and trees by car park – inspected and maintained

Allotments – fenced and gated (insured); noticeboard (insured) rules and regulations issued to tenants.

Pedestal Playing Field – fenced and gated (insured)

Play equipment – insured; inspected weekly; Annual ROSPA inspection. A Child Protection Policy and a Play Policy was adopted on 3rd March 2011. A Risk Benefit document was created on 1st April 2011.

Pedestal Playing Field – car park area marked with post and rails to restrict access of vehicles to field and to create a barrier for children between the play area, the car park and the road.

Christmas trees – 2 properly constructed and covered mounting holes . Two independent lighting meter pillars installed. The National Trust erect the trees and fix the lights. A qualified electrician connected the lights in the tree at the Chorley Road junction.
